

**Minutes of the  
Meeting of the Clark County Drainage Board  
Clark County, Indiana**

April 21, 2015

The Clark County Drainage Board met on April 21, 2015, in Room 418, Clark County Government Building, Jeffersonville, Indiana, at 5:00pm. Present at the meeting were President Mike Killen and Member Les Kavanaugh, Ex-Officio non-voting member County Surveyor David Blankenbeker, secretary Anna McCartney and attorney Bob Bottorff. Vice President Jack Coffman was absent.

For the first order of business, Mr. Kavanaugh moved to accept the minutes of the March 17, 2015, as submitted. Mr. Killen seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

In the next order of business, Mr. Dixon informed the Board of his findings for three drainage complaints. **Brian Castle, 15602 S.R. 60, Borden 47106**—Mr. Dixon referred Mr. Castle to INDOT and Muddy Fork Conservancy District since the problem involves both entities and not a County problem. The Board took no action.

**Sarah Mullins, 209 Mt. Zion Rd, Henryville 47126**—Mr. Dixon informed the Board that the problem involves private property and not in an easement. The Board took no action.

**Eric Williamson, 303 E. Oak St., Otisco, 47163**—Mr. Dixon told the Board that the whole area of Otisco is very flat with no way to drain water away. He has been in discussion with Commissioner Jack Coffman and Jill Saegesser with River Hills about applying for a Community Block Grant in order to get drainage relief for the entire area. The Board took no action.

In the next order of business, the Board discussed the financing of the MS4 Project. They set a Special Meeting for April 30, 2015 at 5pm. Mr. Dixon will invite Rob Huckleby of Stantec to be present. Mr. Bottorff will extend an invitation by letter to Muddy Fork Conservancy officials, Clark County Commissioners and Clark County Council to attend the meeting to help work on a solution.


In the next order of business, three property owners in **Elk Run Subdivision** and developer Jeff Corbett are sharing expenses for the solution of their drainage problem. **308-310 Erin Lane, Ridgeview Subdivision, Henryville**—Mr. Bottorff will follow-up his letter to complainants Keener/Farmer to see if that project will move ahead. Both projects will be delayed until weather and ground conditions improve.

In the next order of business, Mr. Kavanaugh moved to accept the claims as submitted—XBE Inc., March maintenance agreement=\$85; Law Office of Robert G. Bottorff—April attorney fees=\$412.50; Brian Dixon, Annual MS4 Registration Fee=\$85; and Anna McCartney, 1<sup>st</sup> Quarter, 2015, Minutes and Financial Statements as per contract=3,250. Mr. Killen seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.


In the next order of business, Mr. Bottorff updated the Board regarding the contract with Stantac for managing the MS4 project if funding is resolved.
